Below are admission policies that you need to be aware of:

Acceptance is based on the following:

Pre-K	Age four by September 30 th
Kindergarten	Age five by September 30 th . All kindergarteners must be tested. Testing is held during the week prior to the 1 st day of school. Notification of date and time will be mailed the 1 st week of August.
First Grade	Age six by September 30 th . Report cards from past 2 years
2 nd -8 th Grades	G.P.A. of 2.5 or better and conduct grade of B average or better as evidenced by the most recent required report card or transcript.

Notification of acceptance:

Catholics will be notified in writing within a month. Students of other faiths will be accepted and notified after June 1st.

Policy for acceptance:

- 1) Students presently enrolled
- 2) In-Parish siblings
- 3) In-Parish Catholics
- 4) Out-of-Parish Siblings
- 5) Out-of-Parish Catholics
- 6) Siblings of other faiths
- 7) Students of other faiths

Class sizes:

The maximum enrollment allowed in grades 2nd-8th shall not exceed 27 students per class. Pre-K shall not exceed 22 per class. Kindergarten shall not exceed 26 per class. First grade shall not exceed 23 per class. After classes have been filled, all remaining registrations will be kept on file for that school year and as openings become available, applicants will be contacted.
